## MUSIC Grades 1-5

(IN-HOUSE JUDGING will be held on Tuesday, February 7th)

## **GENERAL RULES**

- 1. Time limits: Soloists, five minutes maximum, Groups, eight minutes maximum
- 2. No recorded accompaniment is allowed.
- 3. Required memorization: Piano all solos and duets
- 4. Music may be used by Instrumental soloists and groups
- 5. Soloists and small ensembles may not be directed.
- 6. Beginning pianists MUST HAVE COMPLETED the "primer" or first book in a piano series to participate.
- 7. Piano selections must be written for piano. Piano arrangements of songs are not acceptable.
- 8. Student(s) must submit to the judges one original and 3 copies of the music to be performed.
- 9. ALL MUSIC, original and copies, MUST HAVE THE MEASURES NUMBERED, and deviations from the printed music, such as not doing a marked repeat, must be noted on the copies provided to the judges. The copies of instrumental pieces must be the full score showing the piano accompaniment as well as the solo line played by the performer.
- 10. Performances done without music copies will be judged to give the student feedback but will be disqualified for an award. Without the music the judges cannot evaluate the performance fairly.

## **MUSIC CATEGORIES**

- 1. Piano Solo, recital or concert-type piece
- 2. Piano Duet (one piano, four hands)
- 3. Instrumental Solo.
- 4. Instrumental Duet, Trio (grades 4-5) all the same instruments or mixed
- 5. Instrumental Ensemble (grades 4-5, 4-9 students) all the same instruments or mixed Instruments woodwind, brass, string, classical guitar, melodic percussion (xylophone, bells), percussion will be judged in-school, but is not a category for the State Festival
